A 24-core single mode fiber optic cable contains 24 individual singlemode fibers, typically 9 um core diameter, designed for high-speed, long-distance data transmission in indoor, outdoor, or mixed environments.

A 24-core single mode fiber cable is used to transmit optical signals over long distances with minimal loss. Each fiber has a 9 um core and 125 um cladding, optimized for wavelengths of 1310 nm and 1550 nm. These cables are commonly used in telecom networks, data centers, and intra-building backbones .

- o Indoor Plenum (OFNP): Suitable for air-handling spaces, low-smoke, flame-retardant, ideal for multi-floor deployments .
