

Adding external wiring to the distribution box

Installing external wiring for a distribution box requires careful planning, proper placement, correct wire connections, and thorough testing to ensure safety and compliance.

Step 1: Choose the Right Location

- o Place circuit breakers in their designated slots.

- o Connect each outgoing circuit wire to its corresponding breaker.
- o Follow the principle: phase wire to phase terminal, neutral to neutral, ground to ground.
- o Label each circuit clearly for future maintenance .

Step 6: Arrange and Secure Wires

- o Route wires neatly inside the box.
- o Use cable ties to prevent tangling and maintain separation from sharp edges.
- o Leave space for heat dissipation to avoid overheating .

Step 7: Testing and Verification

- o Perform an insulation resistance test to ensure no short circuits.
- o Use a multimeter to check continuity and verify correct connections.
- o Test each circuit by switching breakers on and off to confirm proper operation .

Step 8: Maintenance and Safety

- o Schedule regular inspections to check for loose connections or damaged insulation.
- o Ensure all components are UL/CE-certified and comply with local electrical codes.
