The square shape allows multiple pigtails to be stacked neatly, reducing wasted space and potentially simplifying cable management in compact installations .

Protection and Durability

Both types are armored, typically with a stainless steel tube encased within the outer jacket, providing superior crush resistance and rodent protection compared to standard pigtails . The choice between square and round does not significantly affect the fiber's intrinsic protection, but square pigtails may offer slightly better stability when bundled tightly in trays.

Installation Considerations

- o Round armored pigtails are easier to bend and route in curved pathways due to their uniform cross-section. They are ideal for installations where flexibility is required.
- o Small square armored pigtails are optimized for high-density environments, such as data centers or ODFs with limited tray space, where stacking and alignment are critical .

Fiber Count and Connector Options

Both small square and round armored pigtails are available in single-mode and multimode fibers, with various connector types such as SC, LC, FC, and ST, and can be simplex or duplex . They also come in different fiber counts (1, 2, 4, 6, 8, 12, 24, 48), allowing customization based on network requirements.
