

Cable tray connection in cable trench

Transition Considerations

- o **Cable Protection:** Cables should be protected from abrasion at the transition point. This can be achieved with smooth edges, protective grommets, or a short conduit section bridging the tray and trench .
- o **Accessibility:** While trenches are typically covered, ensure that the transition allows for inspection and maintenance. Removable covers or lids at the trench entry are recommended .

Installation Steps

- o **Plan the Route:** Determine the exact point where the tray will meet the trench. Consider environmental factors, traffic, and future expansion .
- o **Select Transition Components:** Use a downward ladder tray, solid-bottom tray, or a custom elbow to guide cables into the trench. Ensure the material is compatible with both the tray and trench system (e.g., galvanized steel, aluminum, or FRP), .
- o **Secure the Tray and Trench:** Anchor the tray to walls or supports and ensure the trench is properly lined and covered. The transition section should be firmly fixed to prevent movement .
- o **Route Cables Carefully:** Pull cables through the tray into the trench, using rollers or sheaves if necessary to reduce tension and prevent damage .
- o **Verify Compliance:** Check that cable fill, spacing, and ampacity requirements are met according to NEC or local electrical codes .

Best Practices

- o **Labeling:** Clearly mark cables at the transition for easy identification.
 - o **Environmental Protection:** If the trench is outdoors, ensure the transition prevents water ingress and provides corrosion resistance .
 - o **Future Expansion:** Design the transition to allow additional cables to be added without major modifications.
