Purpose of Cable Tray Covers

Regulatory Guidance

- o NEC Article 392 (National Electrical Code): The NEC does not universally mandate covers for all cable trays. However, covers are required or recommended in situations where cables could be exposed to physical damage, excessive heat, or electrical noise. Solid bottom trays with covers are often used for sensitive instrumentation or control circuits, while ladder-type trays may remain uncovered if ventilation is sufficient .
- o IEC 61537 (International Electrotechnical Commission): This standard provides guidelines for cable tray construction and performance. It emphasizes that trays should be designed to protect cables and maintain safety, which may include the use of covers depending on the application and environmental conditions .

Practical Considerations

- o Ladder trays: Typically left uncovered to allow air circulation and prevent overheating of power cables. Covers may be added if additional protection is needed .
- o Solid or ventilated trays: Often equipped with covers to protect sensitive cables or comply with EMI requirements .
- o Outdoor or industrial installations: Covers are strongly recommended to protect against weather, dust, and mechanical hazards .
