

Can optical fiber cables be pulled using a winch

The minimum bending radius of the cable is also respected by using capstan wheels sized to avoid sharp bends . For long runs, multiple winches may be placed at intermediate points to maintain uniform tension and prevent over-stressing any segment of the cable .

Methods for Long-Distance Pulling

Several techniques are used to extend the length of cable that can be pulled:

- o Intermediate storage and staged pulls: Sections of cable are temporarily stored in a figure-8 pattern above ground and then pulled further in stages .
- o Dual-end pulling: Pulling from both ends of a spool simultaneously to reduce tension on any single segment .
- o Capstan-assisted pulling: Using capstans powered by winches to provide controlled, friction-based pulling .

Practical Considerations

- o Always use a breakaway swivel or torque limiter to prevent over-tensioning .
- o Inspect the winch, hydraulic system, and cable rollers before each pull .
- o Ensure the winch is suitable for the terrain and distance of the pull, as well as the cable type .
- o For underground or conduit installations, proper spacing of winches and careful monitoring of friction points is essential .
