- o Ensure the cover fits securely over the tray to prevent accidental displacement.
- o For solid bottom trays installed outdoors or in humid areas, drill 1/4 -inch weep holes every 3 feet to prevent water accumulation .
- o Use snap-in bushings or clamps for cable exits to protect cable jackets from abrasion and vibration .
- o Maintain proper spacing and bend radius for cables to avoid damage and ensure system reliability .
