Yes, the metal door of a distribution box must be grounded using a dedicated connection to ensure safety and code compliance.

Why Ground the Door

Even if the cabinet body is already grounded, the door can accumulate static electricity or become live if an internal wire contacts it accidentally. Grounding the door ensures that any fault current safely flows to earth, protecting personnel from electric shock and meeting NEC 250.148 requirements, which mandate that all metallic parts of electrical enclosures, including doors, be bonded to ground .

Recommended Grounding Method

For stainless steel or metal distribution boxes:

- o Flexible Connection: Use a braided copper tape or flexible copper wire between the door and the cabinet frame to accommodate movement from hinges .
- o Connection Points: Attach the grounding wire to pre-reserved points or dedicated bolts on the inside of the door panel and the cabinet frame. Ensure bolts are tightened securely.
- o Anti-Loosening Washers: Use serrated or lock washers to maintain electrical continuity and prevent loosening over time .
- o Conductive Paste: Apply a small amount of conductive grease at the contact points to prevent oxidation and maintain low resistance, especially in outdoor or high-humidity environments .

Wire Sizing and Resistance

- o In the US, a 10 AWG (5.26 mm²) ground wire is typically used, while other markets may require 6 mm² .
- o The total grounding resistance between the door, cabinet, and main grounding point should be very low, ideally below 0.1 ohm, to ensure effective fault current dissipation .

Verification

After installation, measure the resistance from any point on the door to the main grounding electrode using a multimeter. High resistance may indicate poor contact, insufficient cleaning of surfaces, or loose bolts .

Maintenance Tips

- o Periodically inspect the grounding connections for corrosion or loosening.

- o Reapply conductive paste if oxidation is observed.
