EU AI Pact and Voluntary Commitments

The EU AI Pact is a voluntary initiative designed to help organizations prepare for the implementation of the EU AI Act. Companies and institutions can join by making pledges to adopt AI governance strategies, map high-risk AI systems, and promote AI literacy among staff. Over 230 organizations, including multinational corporations and SMEs across sectors like IT, healthcare, banking, and automotive, have already signed these pledges, demonstrating early commitment to responsible AI deployment and compliance with EU regulations .

European AI Office

The European Artificial Intelligence Office (EU AI Office), established within the European Commission, supervises and enforces obligations for providers of general-purpose AI (GPAI) models. It coordinates EU-level governance, develops transparency and safety guidelines, and monitors compliance with the AI Act. The office also supports research, innovation, and international cooperation on trustworthy AI. Organizations joining EU AI initiatives interact with this office to ensure their AI systems meet regulatory standards and are audit-ready .

EU AI Cloud and Sovereign AI Infrastructure

Regulatory Context

The EU AI Act, effective from August 1, 2024, establishes a risk-based framework for AI systems, categorizing them as minimal, limited, high-risk, or unacceptable. Providers of GPAI models must comply with transparency, safety, and human oversight requirements, with enforcement by the EU AI Office starting August 2, 2026. Organizations joining EU AI frameworks are expected to align with these obligations, including documentation, risk management, and post-market monitoring .
