

# Fiber Optic Cable Color Separation Order and Price

Fiber optic cable pricing varies by fiber type, count, construction, and color-coded standards, typically ranging from \$0.05 to \$1.50 per meter for standard cables, with higher costs for high-count or custom color-coded configurations.

## Pricing Overview

Fiber optic cable costs depend on several factors:

- o Fiber Type: Single-mode (OS1/OS2) cables are generally less expensive per meter than multimode (OM1/OM2/OM3/OM4) cables, with single-mode ranging from \$0.10-\$0.50 per foot and multimode from \$0.30-\$1.00 per foot .
- o Fiber Count: Higher strand counts increase costs proportionally. For example, a 12-strand cable may cost around \$0.50 per foot, while a 24-strand cable can reach \$1.00 per foot .
- o Cable Construction: Armored cables for outdoor or harsh environments add 20-50% to the base cost, while indoor PVC or LSZH jackets are cheaper .
- o Installation Complexity: Labor, trenching, splicing, and termination can significantly affect total project costs, ranging from \$0.60 to \$3.00 per foot depending on terrain and precision required . Typical price ranges for standard cables are:
  - o Simplex/Duplex Indoor: \$0.05-\$0.30 per meter
  - o Single-mode Outdoor: \$0.10-\$0.50 per meter
  - o Multimode (OM1/OM2/OM3): \$0.10-\$0.60 per meter
  - o Armored Cable: \$0.30-\$1.00 per meter
  - o Aerial/Self-Supporting: \$0.40-\$1.50 per meter

## Color-Coding and Its Impact

Fiber color coding follows the TIA-598-C standard, which assigns a 12-color sequence for identification: Blue, Orange, Green, Brown, Slate (Gray), White, Red, Black, Yellow, Violet, Rose, and Aqua. For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats across multiple buffer tubes . High-count cables (48, 96, 144 fibers) use a "Tube and Fiber" system, where each tube and fiber inside it is color-coded for easy identification.

- o Example: Fiber #45 in a 144-core cable falls into the 4th tube (Brown) and is the 9th fiber (Yellow) inside that tube .
- o Outer jacket colors can indicate fiber type (e.g., Yellow for single-mode, Orange for multimode) and may be customized for OEM or project-specific requirements, which can slightly increase cost .

## Cost Implications of Color Separation

- o Standard Color-Coded Cables: Usually included in base pricing for pre-terminated or bulk cables.
- o Custom Jacket Colors or OEM Printing: May incur additional costs due to low minimum order quantities and specialized manufacturing .
- o High-Count or Pre-Terminated Assemblies: Factory-terminated MPO/MTP trunk cables with color-coded fibers are more expensive due to testing and precision assembly.
