 - o On splice trays or modules to indicate fiber strand connections .
- o Color Coding: Follow standard fiber color codes to differentiate fiber types (single-mode, multi-mode) and match internal fiber colors with external labels .
- o Documentation: Maintain a detailed record of all labels, including fiber routes, splices, and port assignments. Include diagrams or spreadsheets for quick reference during maintenance .
