- o Reseat or Reconnect: Disconnect and firmly reconnect the fiber to ensure proper alignment and engagement .
- o Use a Visual Fault Locator (VFL): A VFL emits a visible laser to trace the fiber path, identify breaks, and confirm continuity from one end to the other .
- o Test with OTDR or Power Meter: Measure signal loss and locate faults along the fiber. OTDR testing can pinpoint breaks, bends, or high-loss splices .
- o Check Equipment: Swap suspect transceivers or modules with known-good units and reboot devices to rule out hardware issues .
- o Verify Polarity and Routing: Ensure fibers are correctly routed and polarity matches the network design to prevent misdetection .

Preventive Measures

- o Maintain clean, dust-free environments for fiber terminations.
- o Follow proper bend radius guidelines and secure cables to prevent strain.
- o Use armored or industrial-grade fiber in high-risk areas.
- o Implement a disciplined inspection and cleaning routine before connecting fibers . By following this
