Trapezoidal Brackets and Connectors: Specially designed brackets allow the cable tray to attach directly to trapezoidal substructures. These brackets accommodate the roof or structural profile shape, providing a stable and level installation .

o

Splice Plates: When joining two straight sections of tray, splice plates are used. They are bolted across the ends of the trays to ensure mechanical stability and electrical continuity .

o

Fasteners: Bolts, nuts, and washers are used to secure the tray to the brackets and splice plates. Fasteners must be compatible with the tray material (aluminum, steel, or galvanized steel) to prevent corrosion and maintain structural integrity .

o

Grounding Considerations: For safety, cable trays may require grounding. NEC Article 392 specifies that trays must meet minimum cross-sectional area requirements for grounding, and aluminum trays should not be used as grounding conductors for circuits above certain amperages .

o

Support Spacing: Proper support spacing is critical. Supports should be installed at intervals recommended by

the manufacturer to prevent sagging and maintain the tray's load capacity .

Practical Tips

- o Ensure the trapezoidal bracket matches the roof profile to avoid misalignment.
- o Use corrosion-resistant materials for outdoor or industrial environments.
- o Verify load ratings for both the tray and the support brackets to accommodate cable weight.
- o Consider accessories like covers or cable protection rings to enhance safety and cable longevity .

By following these connection methods and using compatible trapezoidal brackets, cable trays can be installed efficiently, providing a safe and organized cable management system on trapezoidal structures .
