- o Ensure the fiber length is sufficient to avoid tension when the panel is fully extended (typically at least 31 inches between key points).
- o Use cable ties and movable tie points to secure fibers along the designated paths, preventing bending, crushing, or tangling .

- o Avoid Excessive Bending: Optical fibers are fragile; maintain proper bend radius to prevent signal loss.
- o Label Connections: Clearly label each fiber and port to simplify maintenance and troubleshooting.
- o Environmental Protection: For outdoor installations, ensure the box is weatherproof and UV-resistant.
- o Regular Maintenance: Conduct visual inspections quarterly to check for loose connections, damaged fibers, or dust accumulation .

- o Splicing and Termination: Perform splicing or connector termination carefully, using appropriate tools and protective sleeves.
- o High-Density Management: Utilize the drawer-style design to organize multiple networks without overlapping fibers.
