

How to install sockets in a home electrical distribution box

Installing Socket Boxes

- o Mark the location on the wall where the socket will be installed.
- o Cut or chisel a hole in the wall to fit the socket box. For concrete walls, use a drill and chisel; for plasterboard, a hole saw is sufficient.
- o Insert the socket box and secure it with screws or plaster, ensuring it is flush with the wall surface.
- o Choose the correct box type: plastic boxes are common for indoor walls, while metal boxes are recommended for wooden structures for fire safety.

Wiring the Socket

- o Turn off the main power at the distribution box to prevent electric shock.
- o Run the cable from the distribution box to the socket location, using the appropriate wire gauge for the circuit load.
- o Strip the insulation from the wire ends and connect them to the socket terminals: live to live, neutral to neutral, and ground to the earth terminal.
- o Secure the socket to the box and attach the faceplate.
- o Test the socket with a multimeter or socket tester to ensure proper voltage and grounding.
