

How to install the distribution box clamp plate

Final Checks After installation, perform an insulation resistance test and verify continuity to ensure that the clamp plate and cables are correctly installed and electrically safe . Label the circuits and document the installation for future maintenance.

- o Maintain neat cable management with zip ties to prevent tangling and allow airflow .
