

How to install the pads under the distribution box

To install a pad under a distribution box, prepare a level, reinforced concrete foundation with proper drainage, then allow it to cure before placing the transformer.

Step 1: Site Preparation

Choose a location that meets local utility and regulatory standards, ensuring accessibility for maintenance and emergency access. Clear the area of debris, vegetation, and loose soil. Conduct soil analysis to confirm stability and proper drainage, preventing water accumulation under the pad .

Step 2: Excavation

Excavate the site to match the pad dimensions, typically slightly larger than the transformer base. This allows for proper drainage and ensures the pad is level. The depth should accommodate the pad thickness, usually 6-8 inches for standard transformers .

Step 3: Pad Construction

Step 5: Drainage and Clearance

Ensure the pad is slightly elevated or sloped to prevent water pooling. Maintain proper clearance from buildings, trees, and other structures according to the National Electrical Code (NEC) or local regulations .

Step 6: Transformer Placement

Once the pad is cured, carefully place the distribution box or pad-mounted transformer on the pad. Verify that



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it is level and stable. Follow all safety protocols, including grounding and electrical connection procedures, to ensure safe operation . By following these steps, the pad will provide a stable, durable foundation for the distribution box, ensuring long-term performance and safety.
