

How to use cable management rings and cable management racks

- o Vertical racks/panels: Route cables along the sides of racks, handling longer runs and maintaining proper bend radii for fiber or high-speed data cables .

- o Separate cable types: Use one vertical manager for fiber and another for copper to prevent interference .
- o Label and color-code cables: Simplifies identification and troubleshooting .

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- o Maintain airflow: Avoid blocking ventilation to prevent overheating and equipment failure .
- o Regular inspection: Adjust cable paths periodically to maintain neatness and reduce stress on ports .
- o Document your setup: Keep a record of cable routes and connections for future maintenance .
