Route cables along the designated channels of the cable manager, ensuring that patch cords exit neatly to devices or into vertical managers. Maintain proper bend radius to prevent cable damage and signal degradation .

Step 3: Secure Cables

Use D-rings, finger ducts, or Velcro straps to secure cables within the manager. Avoid over-tightening, which can damage cables, and ensure that bundles are not longer than necessary to prevent tangling . For reusable organization, Velcro ONE-WRAP(R) rolls are effective for bundling and labeling cables .

Step 4: Label and Document

Label each cable clearly using printed tags or color-coded markers. This simplifies troubleshooting, reduces downtime, and allows IT staff to quickly identify connections without disrupting adjacent systems . Maintain a documented map of cable paths for future maintenance or expansion.

Step 5: Maintain Airflow and Safety

Properly organized cables improve airflow, reducing equipment temperatures by 15-20°F and lowering cooling costs . Avoid blocking vents or obstructing hot and cold air pathways. Ensure cables are routed safely to prevent tripping hazards and comply with fire safety codes .
