- o Bundle cables neatly using Velcro straps or reusable cable ties; avoid zip ties that can damage cables .
- o Keep uplink cables (switch-to-switch) separate from server connections to maintain clear critical paths .
- o Leave service loops of 6-12 inches near connections to prevent stress on connectors and allow easy maintenance .

Labeling and Documentation

- o Label both ends of each cable with destination, type, and purpose to speed troubleshooting and maintenance .
- o Use color coding for different functions (e.g., red for power, blue for data, yellow for VoIP) to visually identify cables quickly .
- o Maintain updated diagrams, connection charts, and photos of the completed setup for audits and future upgrades .

Airflow and Cooling

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- o Ensure cables do not obstruct airflow through racks; organized pathways help maintain optimal temperatures and reduce HVAC load .
- o Avoid overcrowding cables, which can lead to overheating and performance degradation .

- o Conduct regular audits to check for loose connections, worn cables, or disorganization .
