

Relocation of power distribution box

Key Considerations

Professional Requirement: Moving a consumer unit or breaker box is not a DIY project. It involves high-voltage connections, and even with the main breaker off, the service wires remain live until disconnected by the utility company. Only a licensed electrician should perform this work to prevent electrocution or arc flash hazards . **Legal and Safety Compliance:** Relocation is considered notifiable work under building regulations. The new installation must comply with current wiring standards, and any pre-existing wiring faults must be corrected before the move . Panels in damp, cramped, or unsafe locations must be moved to meet code requirements and ensure accessibility . **Planning and Inspection:** Before moving the panel, all circuits must be tested for faults, and any hidden wiring issues must be addressed. Cables buried in walls may need rerouting or surface junction boxes to indicate their presence . The relocation site should allow safe access and comply with clearance requirements. **Coordination with Utility Company:** The main service conductors must be de-energized by the utility provider. This ensures that the electrician can safely disconnect and reconnect the panel without risk of live current exposure .

Reasons to Relocate

- o Home renovations or remodeling that block access to the current panel
- o Upgrading the electrical system or adding new circuits
- o Improving accessibility for maintenance or emergency shutoff
- o Compliance with modern safety codes, avoiding placement in bathrooms, closets, or near hazards
- o Repositioning for convenience or aesthetic reasons

- o **Assessment:** Evaluate the current panel, wiring, and potential new location.
- o **Inspection and Testing:** Check all circuits for faults and repair as needed.
- o **Utility Coordination:** Arrange a service disconnect with the utility company.
- o **Panel Removal and Relocation:** Disconnect wiring, remove the panel, and install it in the new location.
- o **Reconnection and Testing:** Reconnect circuits, test for safety, and ensure compliance with codes.
- o **Final Inspection:** Obtain approval from building control or electrical inspector .
