- o Power Down Equipment: Turn off the ONT and router to prevent electrical issues.
- o Release the Connector: Press the release tab (if present) and gently pull the connector straight out. Avoid twisting or bending the cable .
- o Replace Dust Caps: Immediately cover both the cable and ONT port to protect from dust and contamination .

Handling Precautions

- o Avoid Bending: Maintain the minimum bend radius to prevent fiber breakage.
- o Do Not Touch the Fiber Tip: Oils and dirt from fingers can cause signal loss.
- o Store Properly: Coil unused fiber cables loosely and keep them in a clean, dry environment.
- o Use Proper Tools: If stripping or terminating cables, use a fiber optic stripper and cleaning supplies designed for the cable type .
