- o Inspect Fiber Optic Cable: Ensure the cable is undamaged, properly connected, and not bent sharply. Check both ends at the router and wall outlet .
- o Reboot the Router: Turn off the router, unplug it from power for 30-60 seconds, then reconnect and power it on. This often resolves temporary glitches .
- o Verify Connections: Make sure all cables, including power, LAN, and fiber, are securely connected. Replace any damaged cables .
- o Check for Overheating: Place the router in a well-ventilated area and allow it to cool if it feels hot .
- o Factory Reset: If the problem persists, perform a factory reset by pressing the reset button for 10-15 seconds. Reconfigure your network settings afterward .
- o Contact ISP or Technician: If none of the above steps work, your ISP may need to send a technician to inspect the fiber line or replace faulty equipment . By systematically checking these factors, you can identify the root cause of the red light and restore your fiber optic internet connection. Always handle fiber cables carefully to avoid damage.
