

The entire distribution box is out of power

Safety First

- o Look for environmental issues: Moisture, dust, or high temperatures can damage components and cause a total power outage .

- o If the cause is unclear or involves complex wiring, contact a licensed electrician to safely restore power and prevent further damage .

- o Avoid overloading circuits by distributing high-power appliances across multiple circuits .
