- o Best For: Harsh industrial environments, outdoor installations, or areas with high risk of mechanical damage .

- o Load Capacity: Determined by tray type, width, and support span; ladder trays typically support the heaviest loads .

- o Installation Flexibility: Vertical trays can be mounted along walls, inside riser shafts, or within equipment racks, with options for modular fittings and accessories .
