Laos has begun establishing AI infrastructure, including data centers capable of supporting AI workloads, though its AI ecosystem is still in early development.

Current AI and Data Center Landscape

Laos is actively developing its digital and AI infrastructure, leveraging its abundant hydroelectric power and strategic location in Southeast Asia to support energy-intensive operations like AI computing . Key data centers include:

- o GDMS National Cloud: Integrates two government-owned National Data Centers, offering colocation, dedicated servers, and cloud services suitable for AI applications .
- o Unitel and Lao Telecom Data Centers: While specific AI server details are limited, these facilities support high-speed internet, 5G, and cloud computing services, indicating readiness for AI workloads .

AI Initiatives and Projects

The Lao government has launched several initiatives to advance AI capabilities:

- o National AI System: In October 2025, Laos unveiled its first large-scale AI system, the Lao National Large Language Model, developed in partnership with ALO Technology Group and the China-Lao Information Communication Centre. This system is designed to support sectors like agriculture, education, public health, and tourism .
- o AI Innovation Center and Special Economic Zone: A feasibility study is underway to establish an AI Innovation Center and a dedicated AI Special Economic Zone in Vientiane, focusing on green-powered AI infrastructure .
- o National Health AI Platform: Laos is collaborating with Chinese partners to implement AI in public health management, including disease analysis and digitization of medical records .

AI Ecosystem Status

While Laos has operational data centers and is developing AI infrastructure, the AI ecosystem remains nascent. Most AI development is driven by government initiatives and international partnerships, with limited local AI startups and research output . Early AI applications are focused on agriculture, education, and public services, emphasizing productivity and sustainable development .
