They may also allow remote outlet-level control and integration with DCIM software . 6. **Ground-Fault Interrupter (GFI) Module** This component prevents electrical hazards by detecting ground faults and interrupting power to protect personnel and equipment . 7. **EMI Filters** Electromagnetic interference (EMI) filters prevent excess noise from entering the power line, ensuring stable and clean power delivery . 8. **Auxiliary Outputs** Some PDUs provide auxiliary outputs to monitor breaker status or connect additional devices, enhancing system visibility and management . 9. **Environmental Sensors (Optional)** Advanced PDUs may include temperature, humidity, and airflow sensors to monitor the data center environment and optimize cooling and energy efficiency .
