

What fiber optic cables does the mobile router support

Cable Type and Connectors

- o Single-mode fiber: Used for most residential and mobile fiber connections due to its ability to carry data over long distances at high speeds.
- o Connector type: SC-APC (Angled Physical Contact) connectors are standard for GPON or XGPON networks, which are widely deployed by ISPs. These connectors reduce back reflection and maintain signal integrity.
- o Multimode fiber: Less common in home or mobile setups; typically used in short-distance applications like data centers.

How It Connects to Routers

- o Fiber to ONT: The single-mode SC-APC fiber connects to the ONT provided by the ISP.
- o ONT to Router: The ONT converts optical signals to electrical signals, which are then transmitted to the router via a high-speed Ethernet cable (Cat6a or higher recommended for gigabit speeds).
- o Direct Fiber Routers: Some advanced routers have SFP/SFP+ slots that can accept fiber modules, but these must be compatible with the ISP's GPON/XGPON protocol. Standard consumer routers cannot directly accept fiber without an ONT or compatible module.

Key Considerations

- o Protocol compatibility: Ensure the router or SFP module supports the ISP's GPON/XGPON standard.
- o Distance and speed: Single-mode fiber supports longer distances and higher speeds than multimode, making it ideal for mobile and home fiber setups.
- o Connector type: SC-APC is preferred for residential fiber due to low signal reflection and high reliability.
