

What is the spacing between the supports of a five-layer cable tray

Article Overview

The typical support spacing for a multi-layer cable tray ranges from 1.5 to 3 meters (5 to 10 feet), but exact spacing should be determined based on tray type, load, and manufacturer specifications.

General Guidelines

For standard horizontal cable trays, supports are generally installed every 1.5 to 3 meters (5 to 10 feet) to prevent sagging and maintain structural integrity, while heavy-duty or long-span trays can handle distances up to 6 meters (20 feet) between supports . The spacing must account for the total weight of the cables, especially in a five-layer configuration, which significantly increases the load on each support .

Multi-Layer Considerations

- o Vertical clearance: Each tray layer should have a minimum vertical spacing of 150 mm (6 inches) to allow for heat dissipation, maintenance, and cable expansion .
- o Load distribution: In a five-layer tray, the cumulative weight may require closer support spacing than a single-layer tray to prevent excessive deflection. Deflection should not exceed 1/200 of the span for standard trays and 1/150 for spans ≥ 6 meters .
- o Support type: Use fixed supports at tray ends, corners, T-junctions, and at intervals along long runs. Hanging rods should be at least 8 mm in diameter for stability .

Environmental and Safety Factors

- o Outdoor or high-temperature environments may require additional supports or protective covers to accommodate thermal expansion and prevent cable damage .
- o EMI considerations: Maintain adequate spacing between power and signal trays (typically ≥ 300 mm) to reduce electromagnetic interference .

Practical Recommendation

For a five-layer cable tray system, it is advisable to consult the manufacturer's load chart and consider the total cable weight. In most cases, support spacing of 1.5 to 2 meters (5 to 6.5 feet) is recommended for multi-layer trays to ensure safety, minimize deflection, and allow proper airflow and maintenance access . By following these guidelines, the cable tray system will maintain structural integrity, comply with NEC 392 standards, and provide safe, efficient cable management.
