 - o Indoor Drop Cable: Compact, lightweight, often butterfly-shaped or flat, reinforced with FRP or steel for residential or office environments (GJXFH, GJXH, GJXKH)
 - o Outdoor Self-Supporting Cable: Designed for aerial deployment, reinforced with steel wire, UV-resistant, and water-blocking layers (GJYXCH, GJYXFCH, GJYXKCH)
 - o Flat Drop Cable: Flat polyethylene sheath with loose tube fibers and FRP reinforcements, suitable for high tensile and compression resistance
 - o Round Drop Cable: Single bend-insensitive fiber with dielectric strength members, ideal for flexible routing in tight spaces
