Connection Path

- o Fiber Entry: The fiber cable enters your home either overhead from a utility pole or underground through a conduit .
- o NID (Optional): The cable may terminate at an exterior NID for protection and service access .
- o ONT Installation: Inside, the ONT is installed near power and networking equipment. A Cat6 cable typically runs from the ONT to your router to distribute internet throughout your home .

Tips

- o The ONT should be in a dry, accessible location with minimal temperature extremes.
- o Avoid placing it in high-traffic areas or near heat sources to prevent damage to the fiber cable .
- o If you are unsure of the exact location, your ISP technician can show you where the ONT and any exterior NID are installed . By understanding these components, you can identify the fiber optic box in your home and ensure proper connectivity for your high-speed internet.
