

Where is the fiber optic patch cord interface for surveillance cameras

A fiber optic patch cord is a pre-terminated fiber cable that connects surveillance cameras to network equipment, transmitting video and data over long distances with high speed and minimal interference.

What It Is

A fiber optic patch cord (also called a fiber jumper) is a short cable with connectors on both ends that links two fiber devices, such as a surveillance camera and a network switch or media converter, allowing them to communicate efficiently . Unlike copper cables, it transmits data as pulses of light through glass or plastic fibers, which enables higher bandwidth and longer transmission distances .

Structure

A typical fiber optic patch cord consists of:

- o Core: The central glass or plastic fiber that carries light signals .
- o Cladding: Surrounds the core and reflects light back into it to maintain signal integrity .
- o Strength Members: Usually aramid yarn (Kevlar) to provide durability and prevent breakage .
- o Protective Jacket: Shields the fiber from physical damage and environmental factors .

Types

- o Single-mode (SM): Narrow core for long-distance transmission, ideal for large campuses or multi-building surveillance networks .
- o Multi-mode (MM): Wider core for shorter distances, suitable for indoor or small-scale installations .
- o Simplex: One fiber for unidirectional data flow.
- o Duplex: Two fibers for bidirectional communication, commonly used in IP camera systems .

Connectors

Common connector types include LC, SC, ST, and MTP/MPO, chosen based on the camera and network equipment ports . LC connectors are compact and widely used for modern IP cameras, while SC and ST connectors are often found in legacy systems .
