

# Wiring the network cabinet lights

## Article Overview

Network cabinet lights can be safely installed using low-voltage LED strips or puck lights, with careful planning for power supply, wiring routes, and cable management.

## Planning Your Lighting

Before installation, assess the cabinet size, number of devices, and desired illumination. Decide whether you want continuous LED strips for even lighting or puck/spotlights for focused illumination. Determine the power source: low-voltage (12V or 24V DC) systems require a driver or transformer, while line-voltage (120V AC) systems connect directly to a switched circuit . Calculate the total wattage to ensure the power supply can handle the load .

## Wiring Methods

- o Low-voltage LED systems: Connect the LED lights to a driver that converts standard AC to DC. Use two-wire connections for single-color LEDs and four- or five-wire connections for RGB or RGBW LEDs . Route wires neatly along the cabinet edges, securing them with cable ties or clips .
- o Line-voltage systems: Use NM (Romex) cable from a switched power source to the first fixture. Connect the black (hot) wire to the fixture's hot input and the white (neutral) wire to the neutral input. Ground the fixture according to code .

## Installation Tips

- o Mount lights toward the front edge of the cabinet to maximize illumination and reduce glare .
- o Plan wire routing carefully to avoid obstructing airflow or access to equipment .
- o Separate power and network cables to prevent interference, and label all wires for easy maintenance .
- o Use appropriate wire gauge: 18 AWG is typically sufficient for indoor low-voltage LEDs, but check the load requirements .
- o Secure fixtures with brackets or adhesive mounts, ensuring they do not interfere with rack-mounted equipment .

## Safety and Compliance

- o Turn off the circuit breaker before wiring to prevent electrocution .
- o Verify local electrical codes and NEC requirements for cabinet lighting, especially for hardwired installations .
- o Consider professional assistance if hardwiring or high-voltage connections are required .

## Cable Management

- o Route wires along the cabinet edges or behind rails to maintain a clean, organized appearance .
- o Use zip ties, clips, or channels to secure wires and prevent tangling.
